Requirements

- Must – AO Trauma member
- Must - Active trauma or orthopedic surgeon contributing to the AO Trauma community
- Must - National and regional networks and strong personal relationships
- Must - Recognized member or officer on key national, regional or trauma associations
- Must - International experience e.g. fellowship, faculty
- Must - Good command of English
- Must - Highly motivated to develop and manage interpersonal connections across professional specialties
- Must - Good/ clear communicator, good listener; ability to work in multi-cultural environments; should be experienced in working with committees/ boards
- Must - Prepared to commit adequate time (e.g. 5 days per month) to AO Trauma CDC planning and communication needs
- Must - Willingness to travel internationally
- Must - Cannot hold other governance position in AO Trauma (except task forces, knowledge forums and Trustee). If elected and the candidate wants to assume the position, he/ she will be required to resign the other position

- Desired - strong reputation in both the fields of science and education (including international publications and faculty experience)
- Desired - Knowledge of Microsoft Office and some IT fluency

Responsibilities

AO Trauma AP CDC Chairperson has the following functions and duties:

- Define the AO Trauma community development focus and priorities based on feedback from the community and on current trends in the field of trauma and orthopedic surgery (includes the review and update of member benefit offerings), incl. AO Trauma membership
- Represent AO Trauma Asia Pacific Community Development Committee within the AO Trauma Community Development Commission
- Advise the AO Trauma Community Development Commission on matters related to community development in Asia Pacific
- Supervise and monitor AO Trauma CDC projects
- Comply to the AOF Shared values and the Code of Ethics
